
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It is the first day of the school holidays. Sipho and his mom are preparing for their trip to KwaZulu-Natal to see Sipho's father.

They arrived when the sun was about to set. Sipho was very happy to see the huge buildings and roads.



His mother asked him why he was crying. He told her what is wrong.




His mother decided to talk to the other children. They all made a plan to teach Sipho the language.
