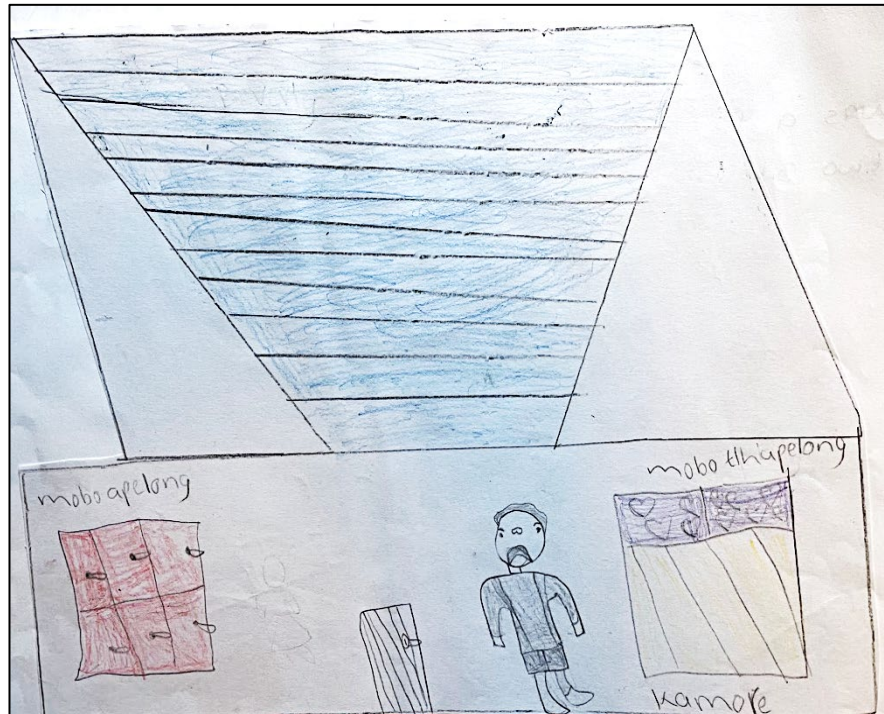

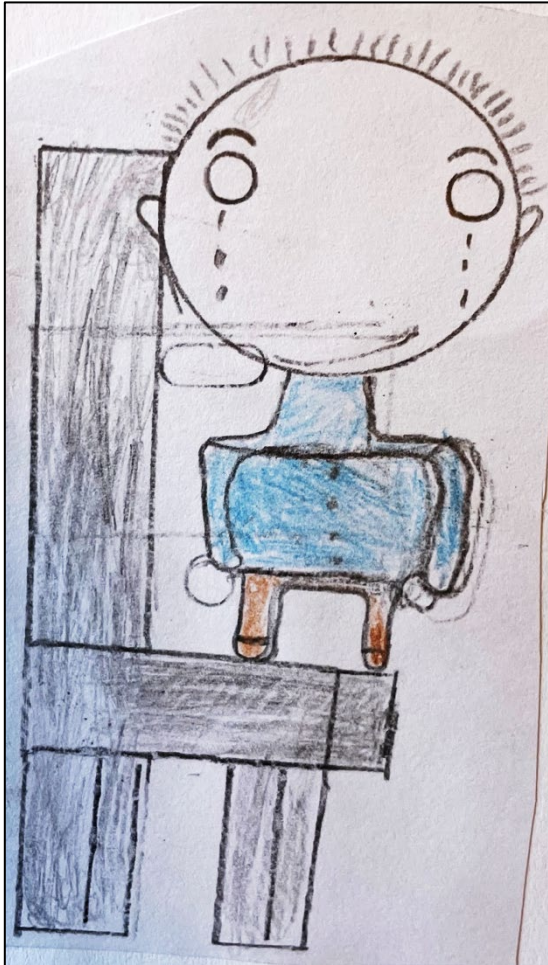
There was a boy called Modise. He was tall and light in skin colour. He was staying with his two siblings in a village called Manyeding.



On Monday morning, when Modise was preparing to go to school, he has put on his white school shirt, blue jersey and brown school trousers.



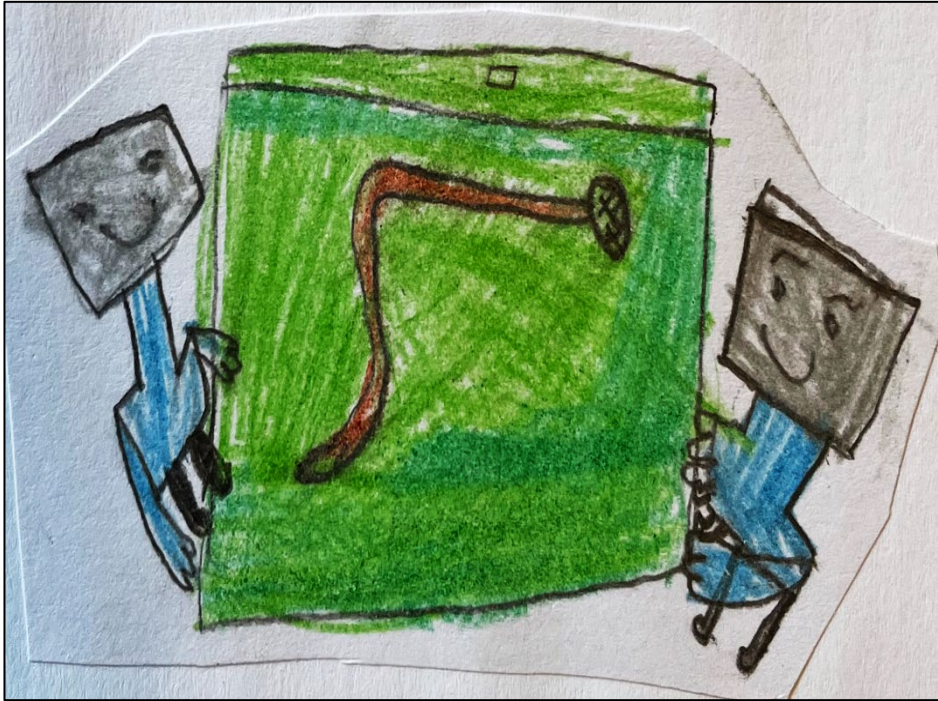
Modise wanted to put his school socks on but could not find the other one. He looked for it in a cupboard and saw a snake in a green box.
