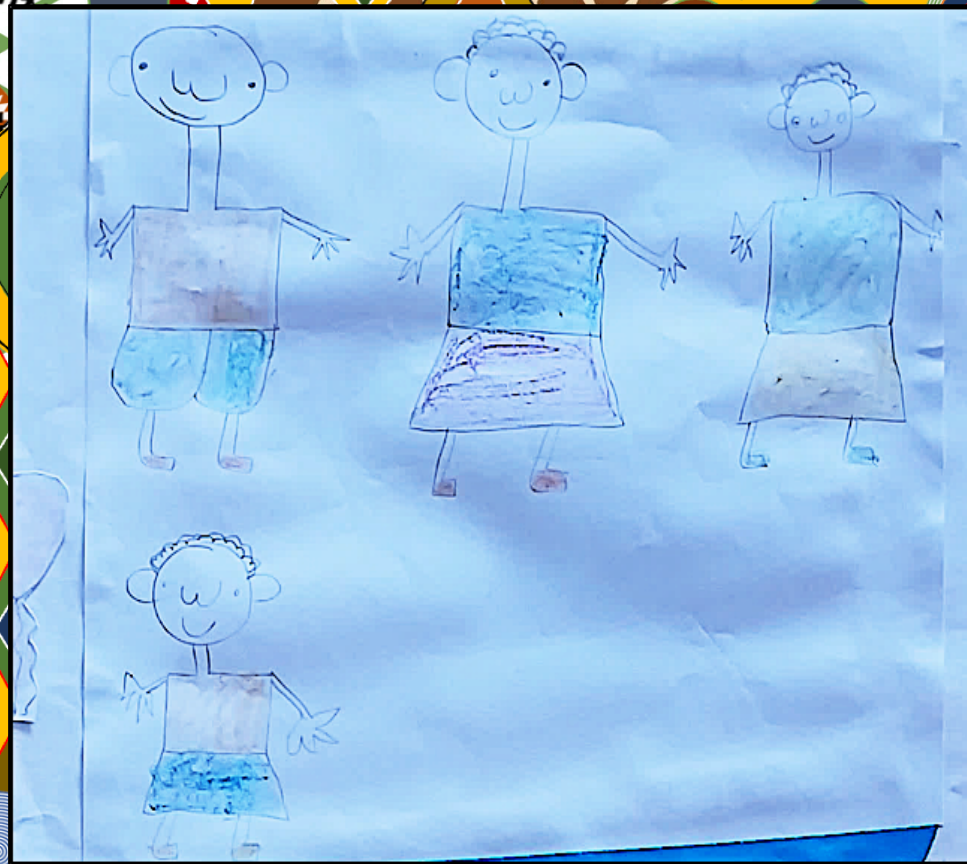

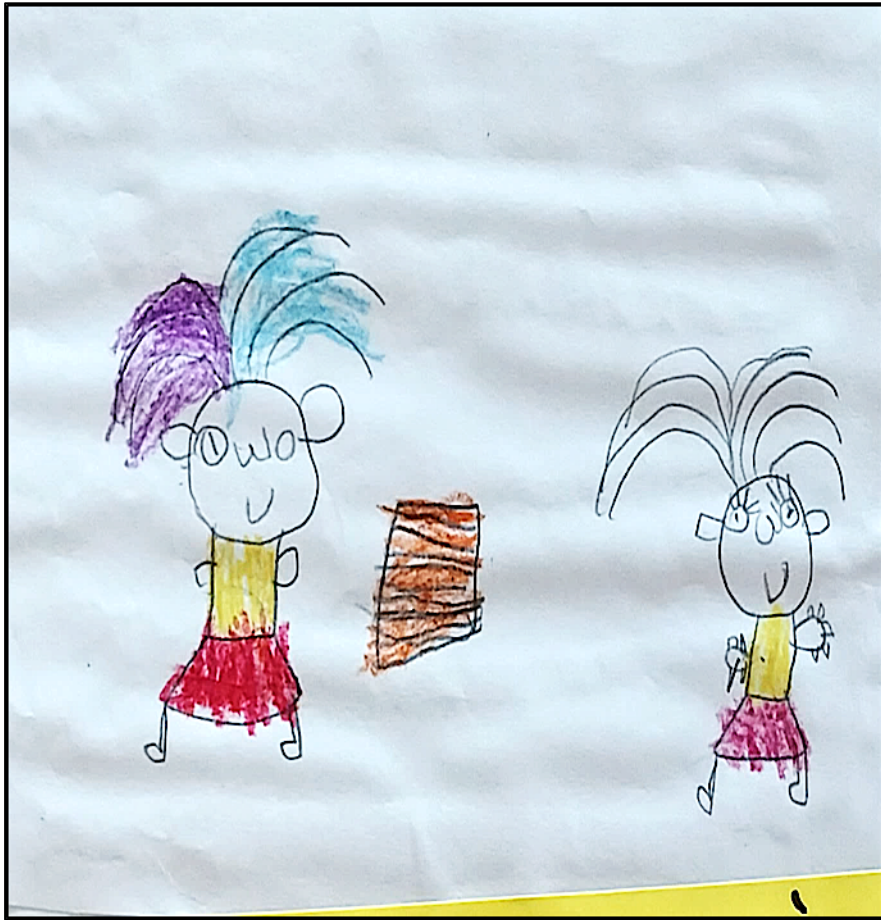

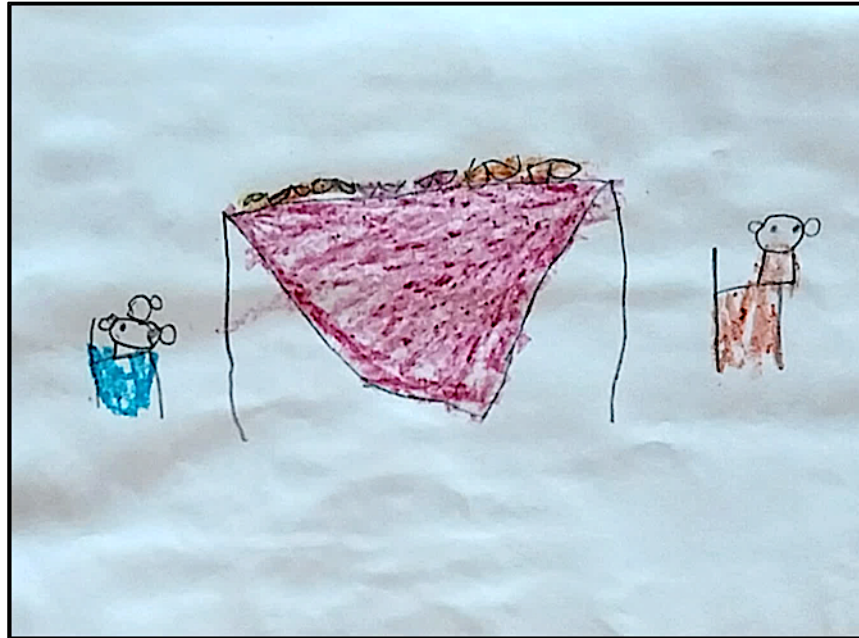
Granny likes to read a

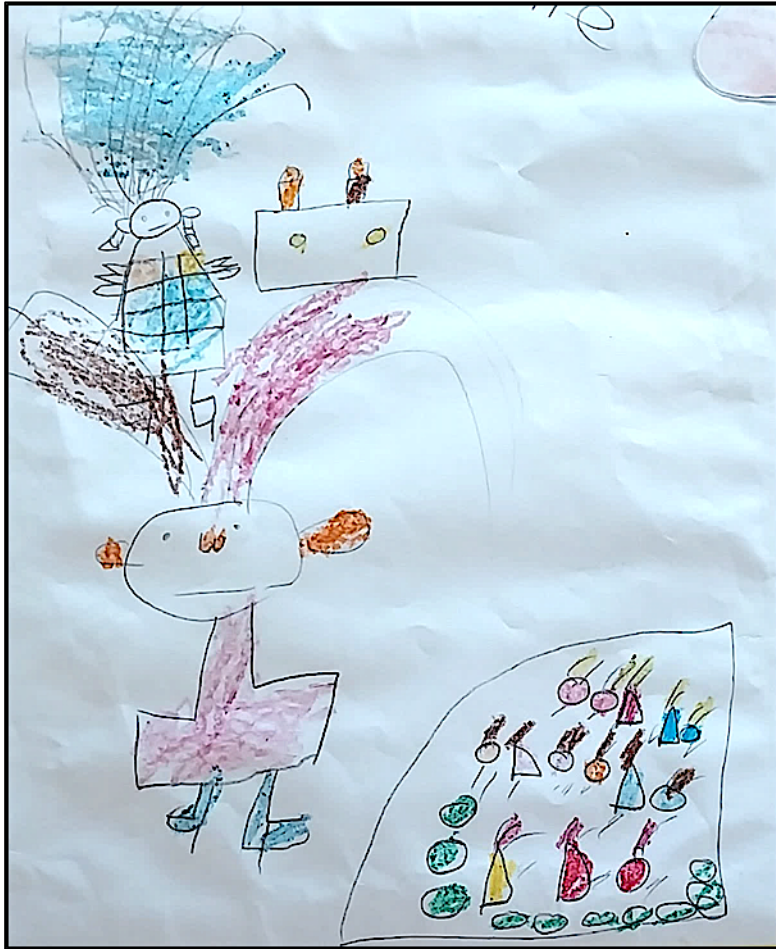
Grandfather Thabo likes
