called Dimpho.

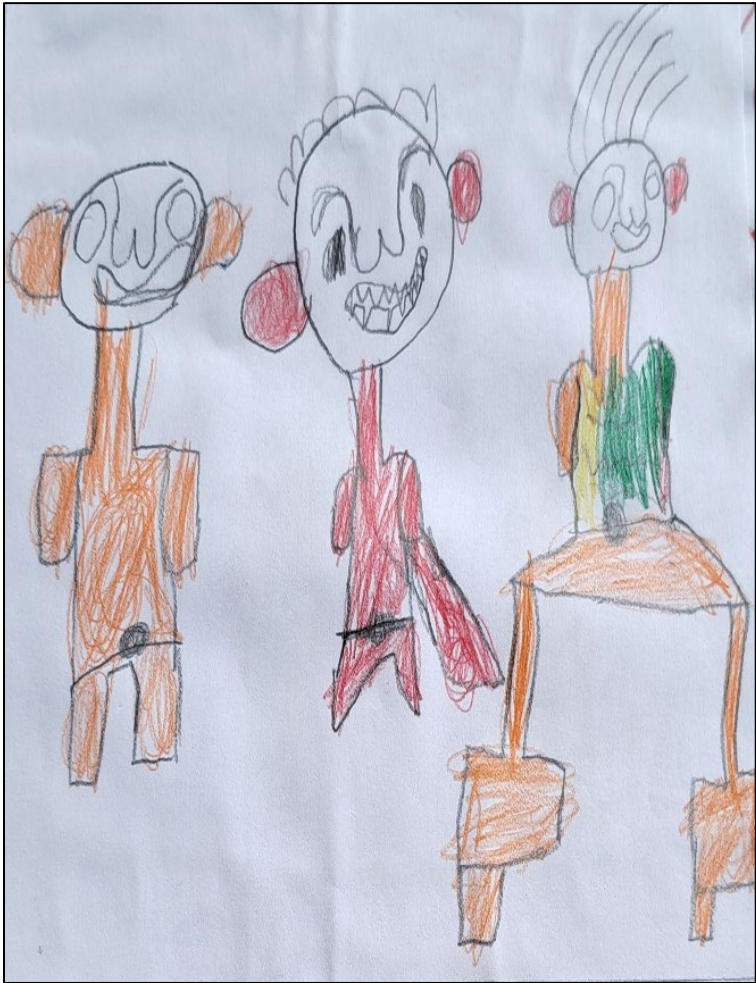


Dimpho had two children, a boy and a girl called Tshupo and Oboitshepo.
