sports ground.



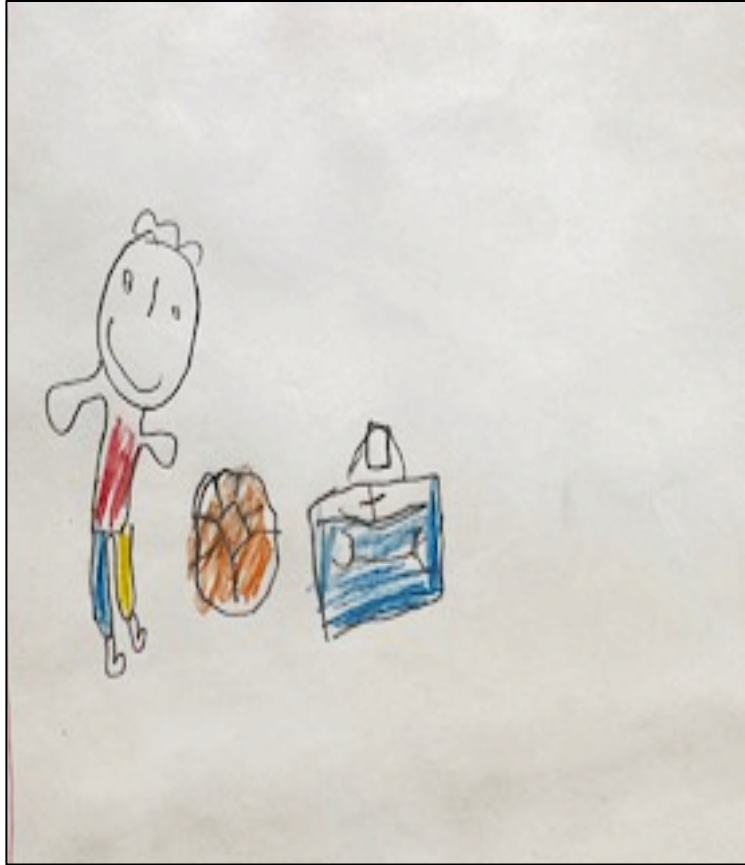
When they arrived at the sports ground, they played, kicking the new ball.
