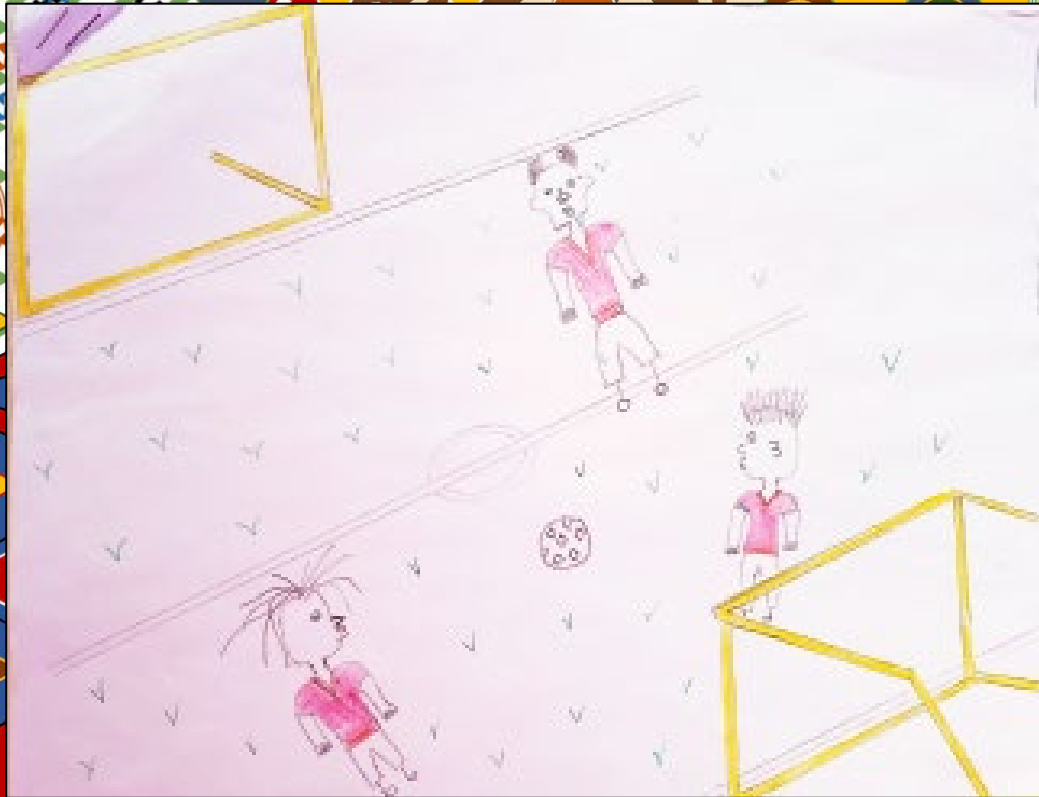

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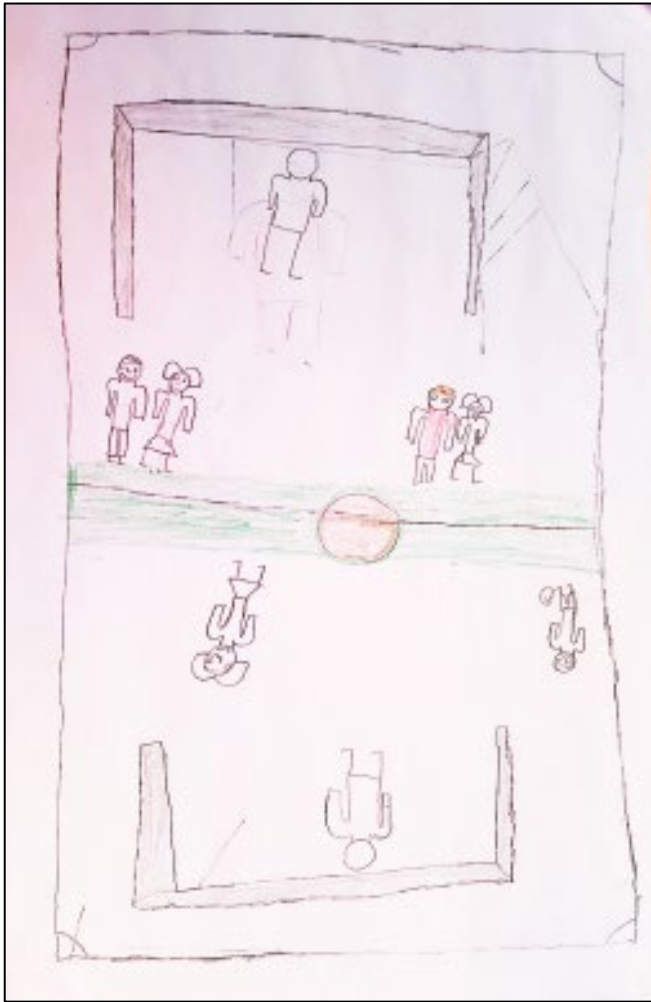
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“Ding-ding-ding”. The school bell at St Mary’s Primary School rang. It’s playtime.

quickly.

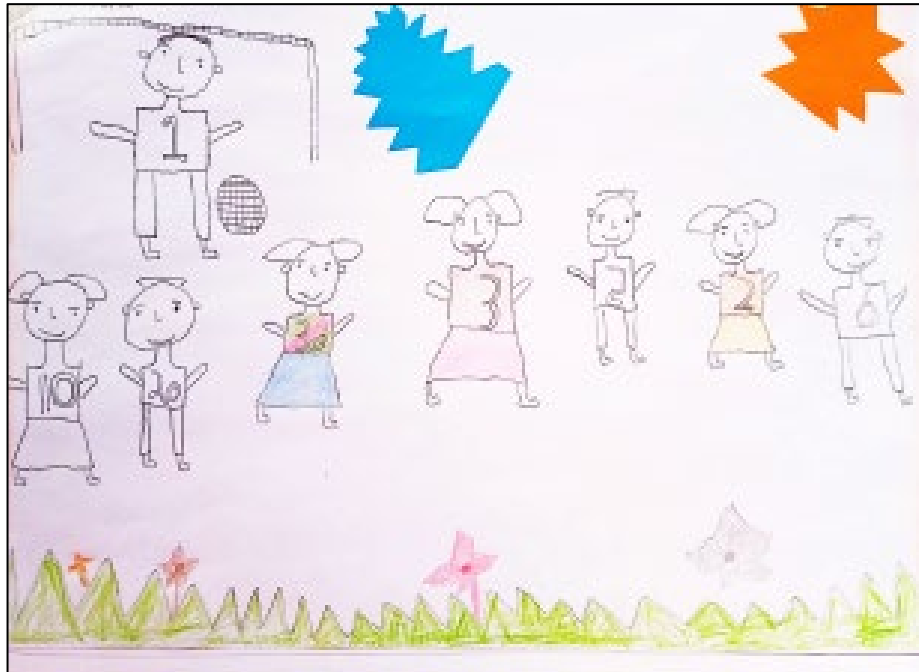


Teacher Motladiile came rushing with a first aid kit in his hand. “I’ve told you to play nicely”, said teacher Motladiile.
