




Ms Karabo was baking bread in the early morning, and the bread smelled so good.

She took her phone and called Mr Letsapa to come and eat lunch with her.





After a while, he started calling Ms Karabo again. Ms Karabo was looking at herself in the mirror to make sure she really looked good.




Mr Letsapa felt that Ms Karabo was wasting his time, so he ate all of the freshly baked bread.




Ms Karabo finally came out of her room, she looked by the window, and there was no bread.
