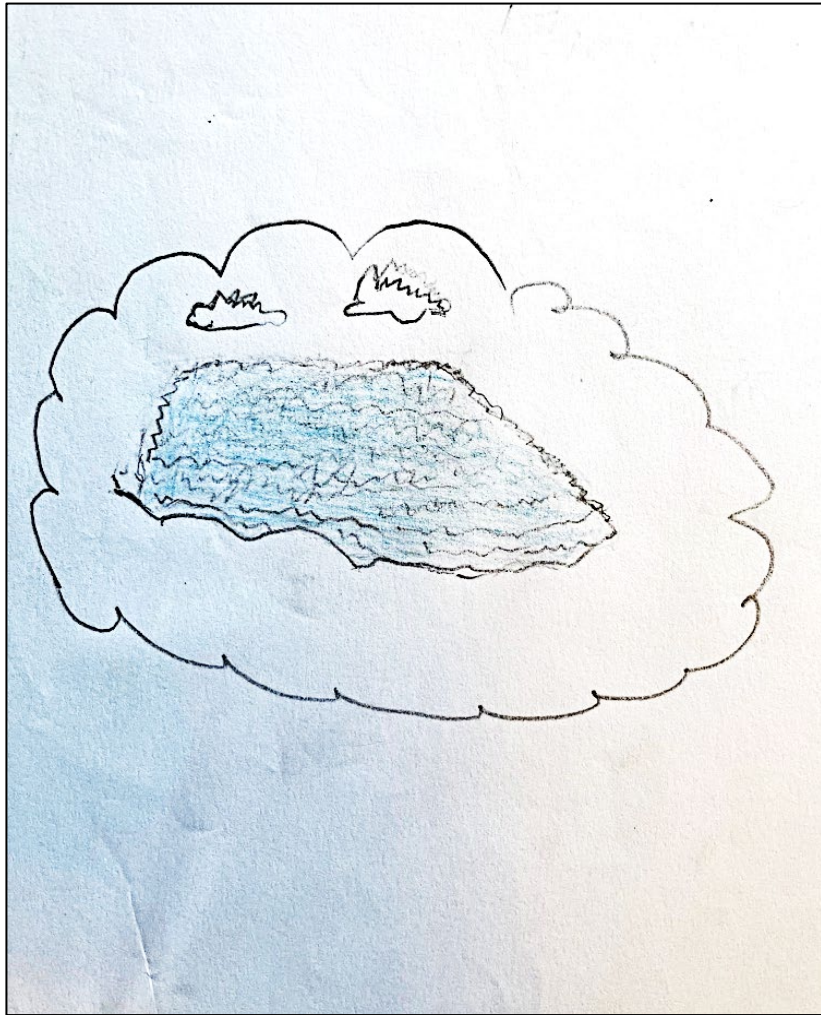

three learners only.



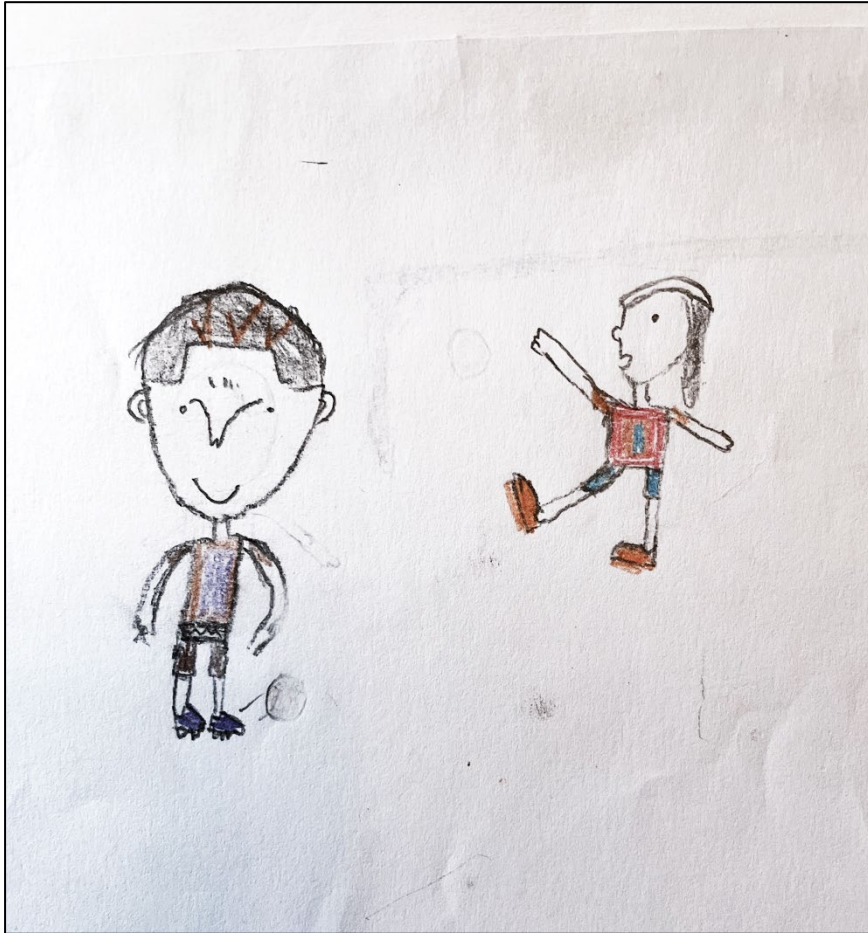

On Friday morning at three, their transport arrived, and all the learners were ready for the trip.

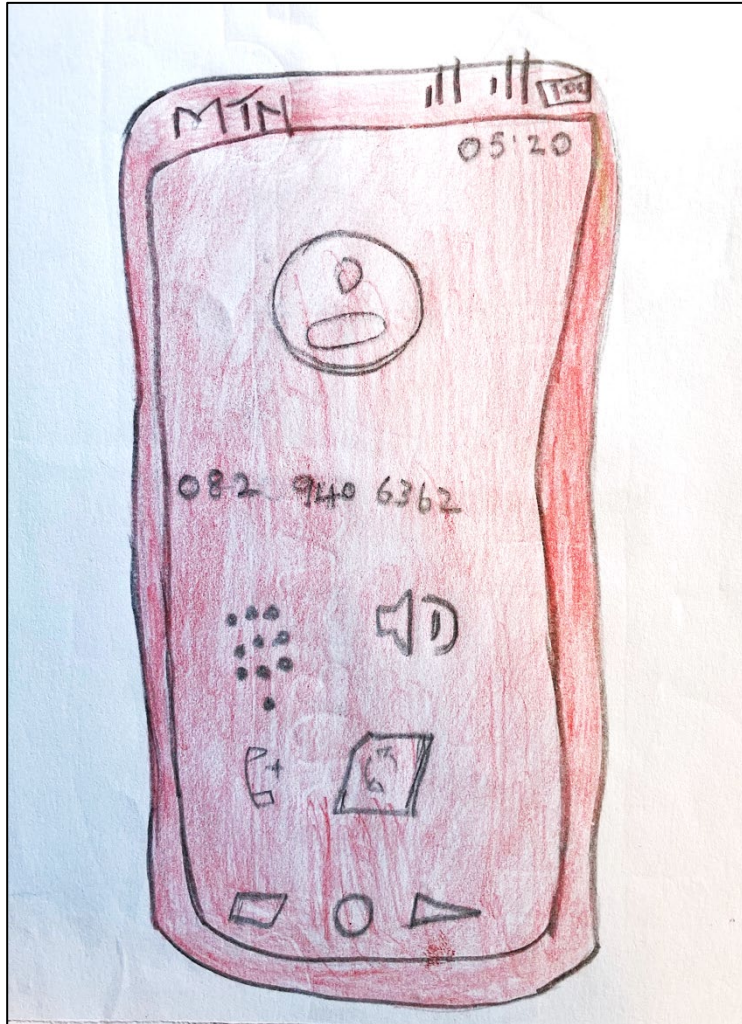


All the learners were
