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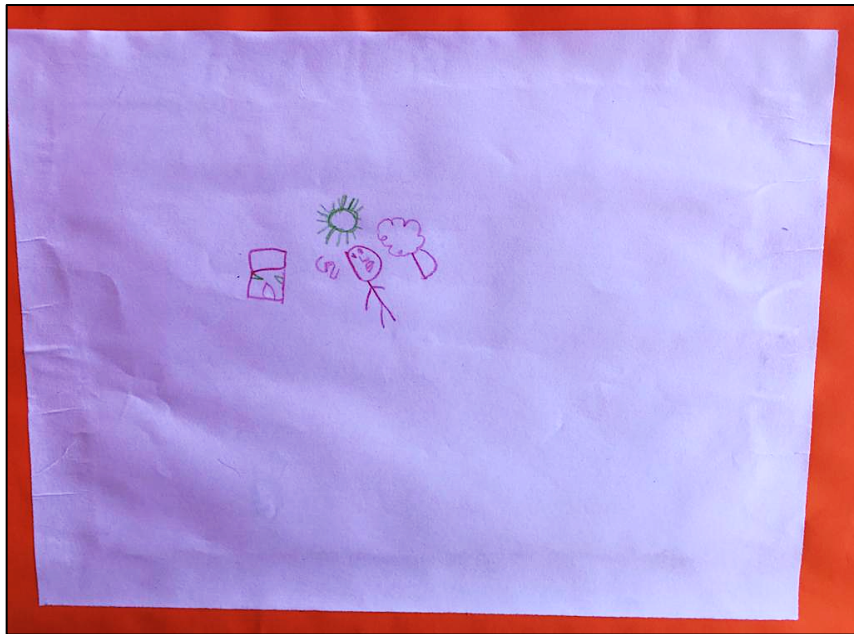
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My name is Kgosi. I stay

Motlhabeng village.



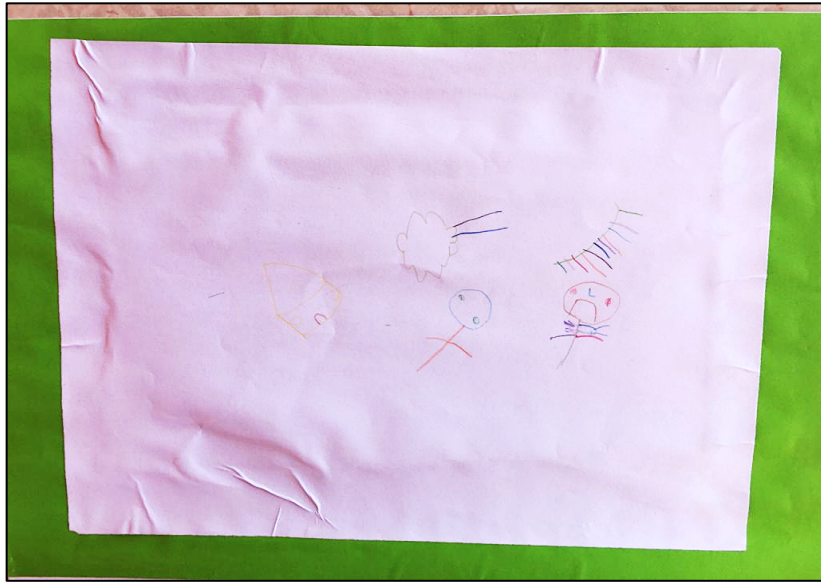
I am a boy who used to
