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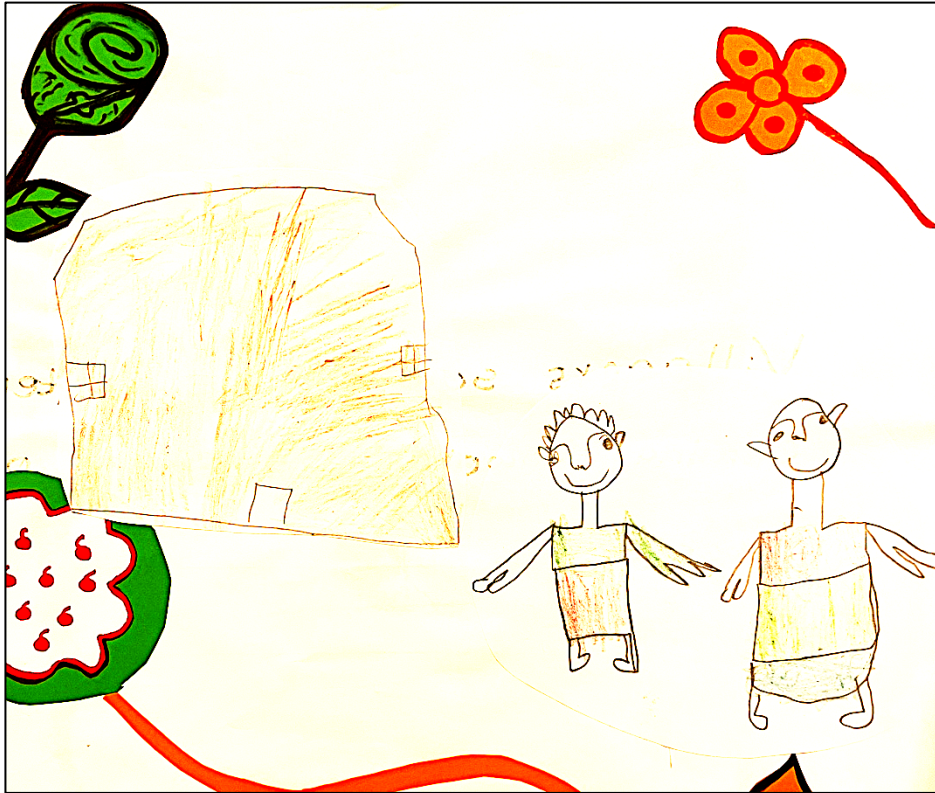
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The villagers saw a lot of water coming towards the village of Brooksby.



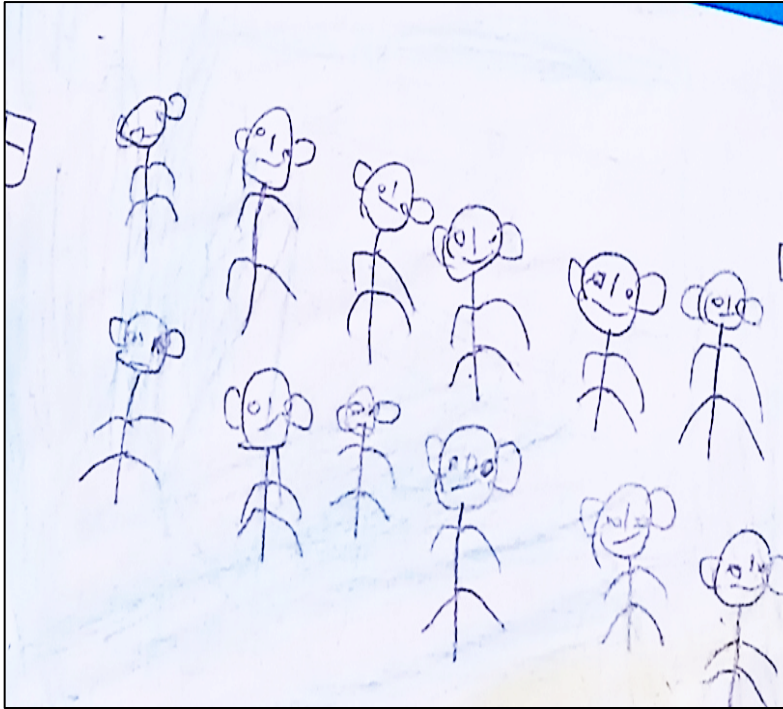
Every day, the water

The villagers were always wearing boots to walk safely into the water.



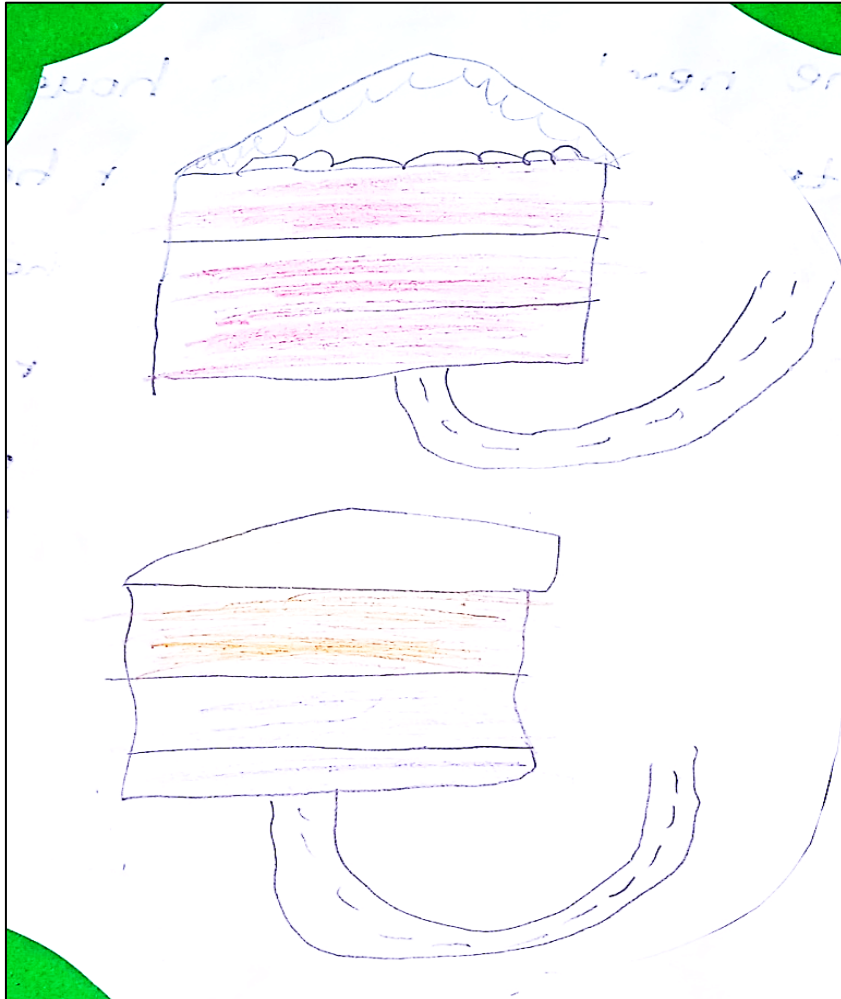
The villagers had a meeting
