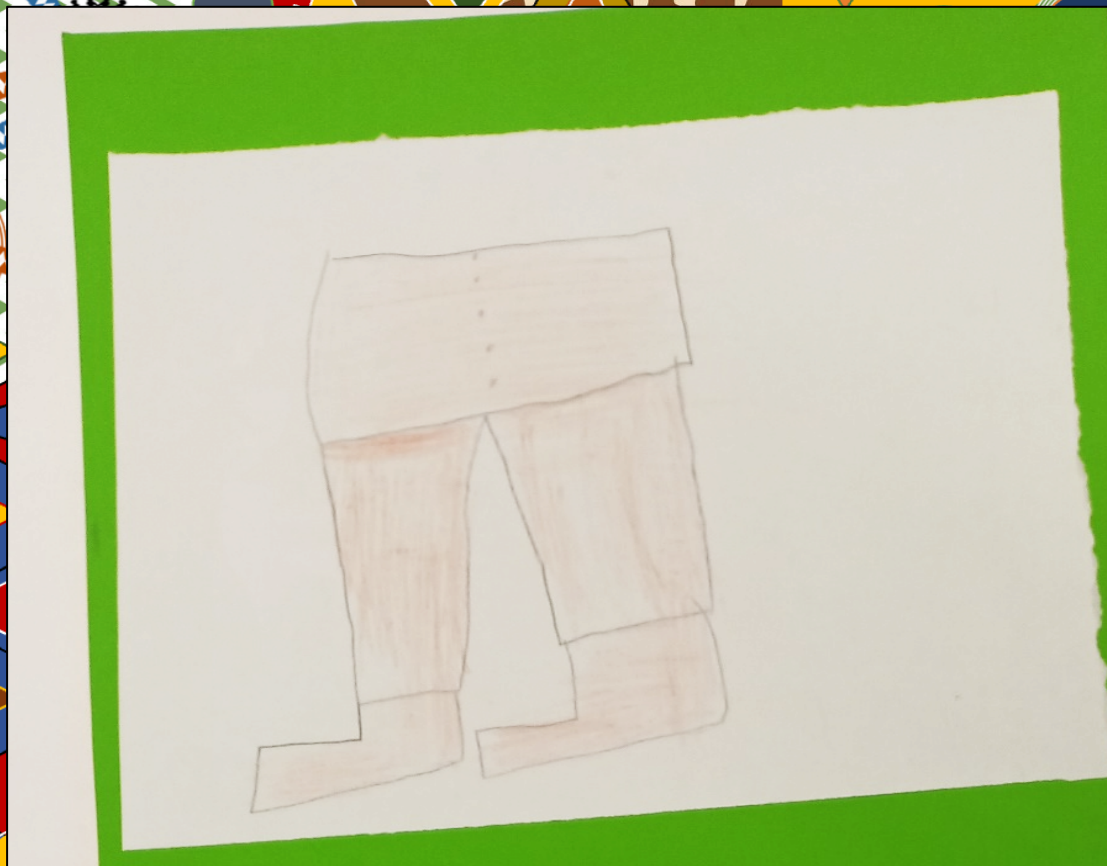

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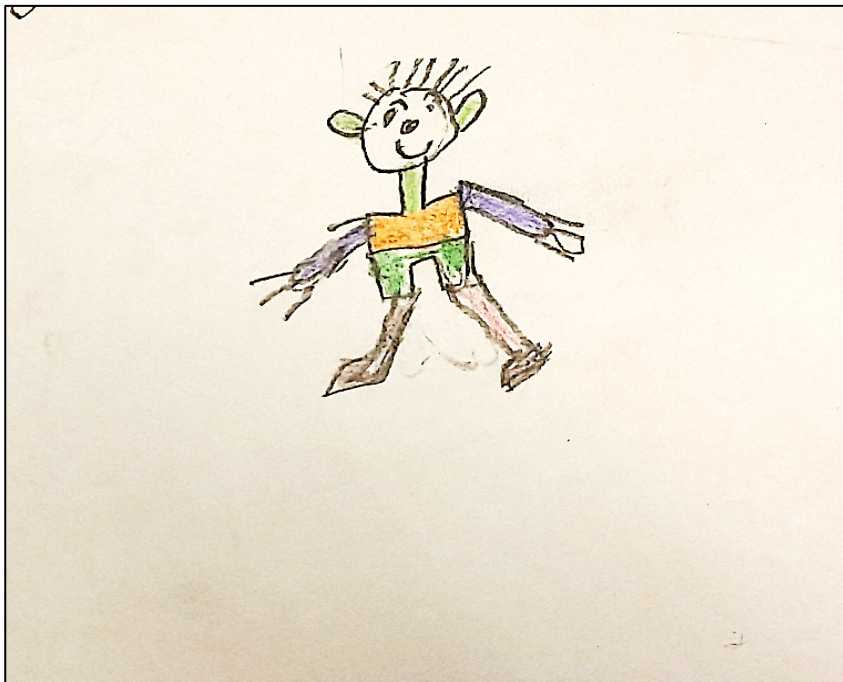
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My name is Ikgopoleng, I

said Kgosietse.

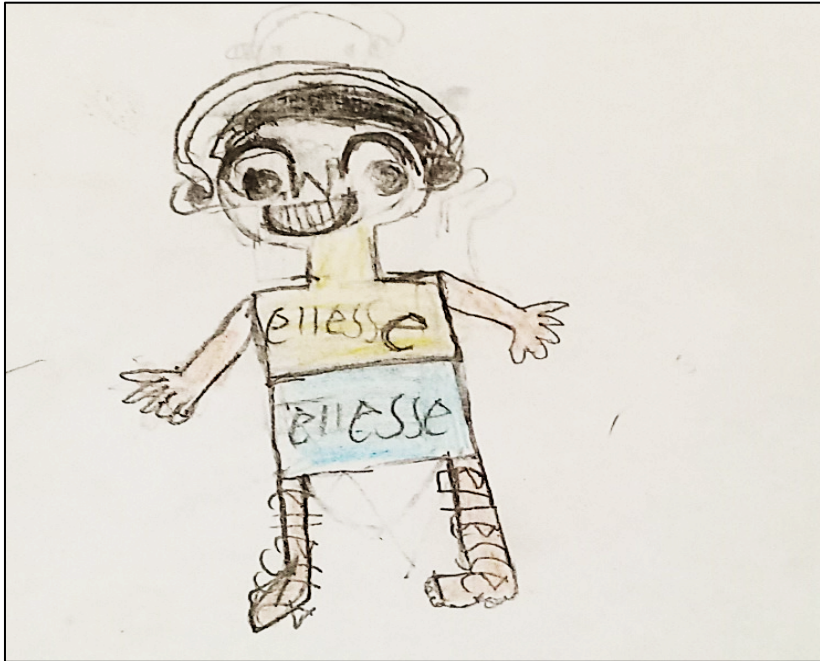




My name is

with my legs.

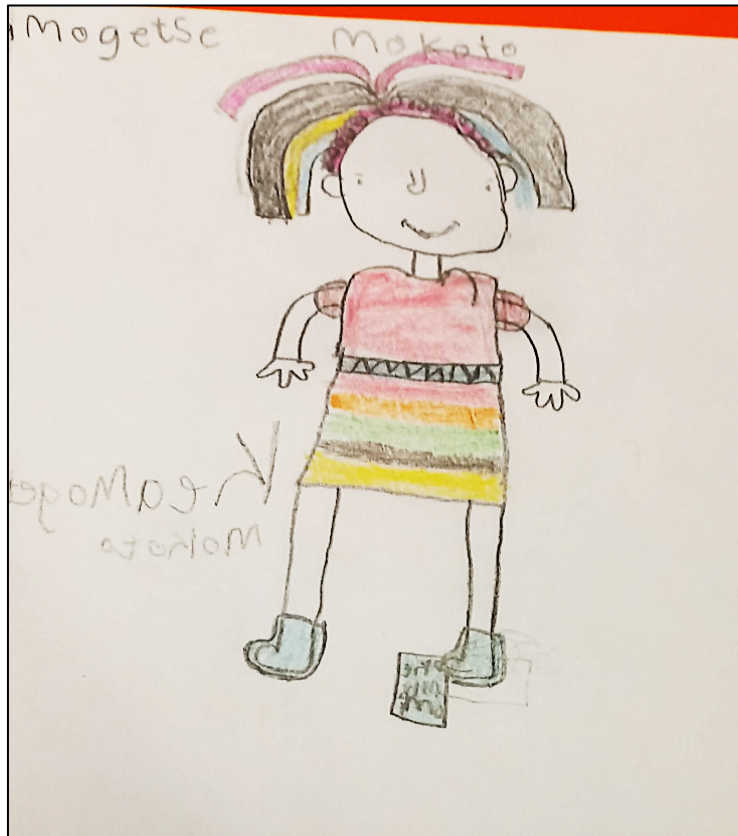


“I can dance with my legs”,  
said Tshepang.

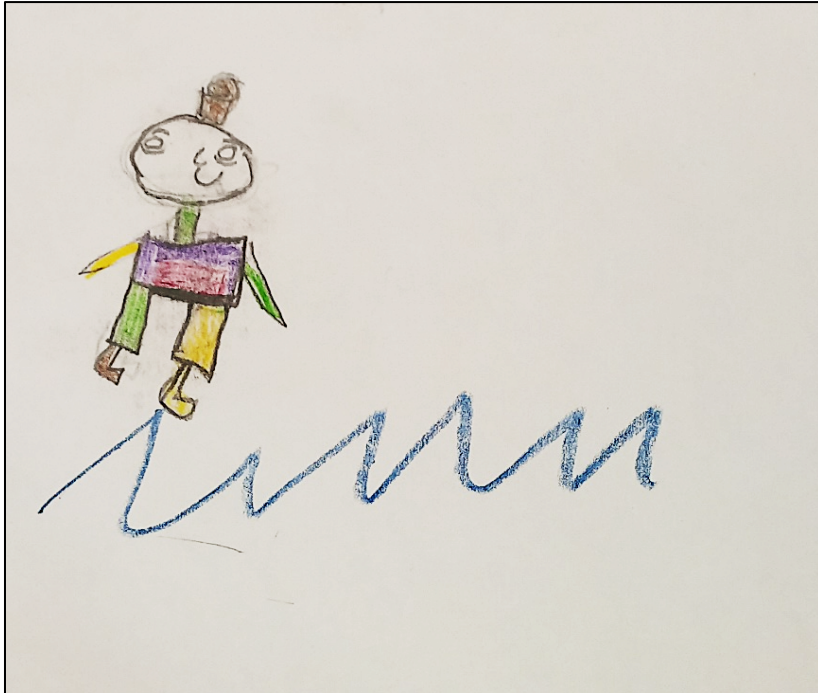


"I can use my legs to climb the tree," said Omogolo.
