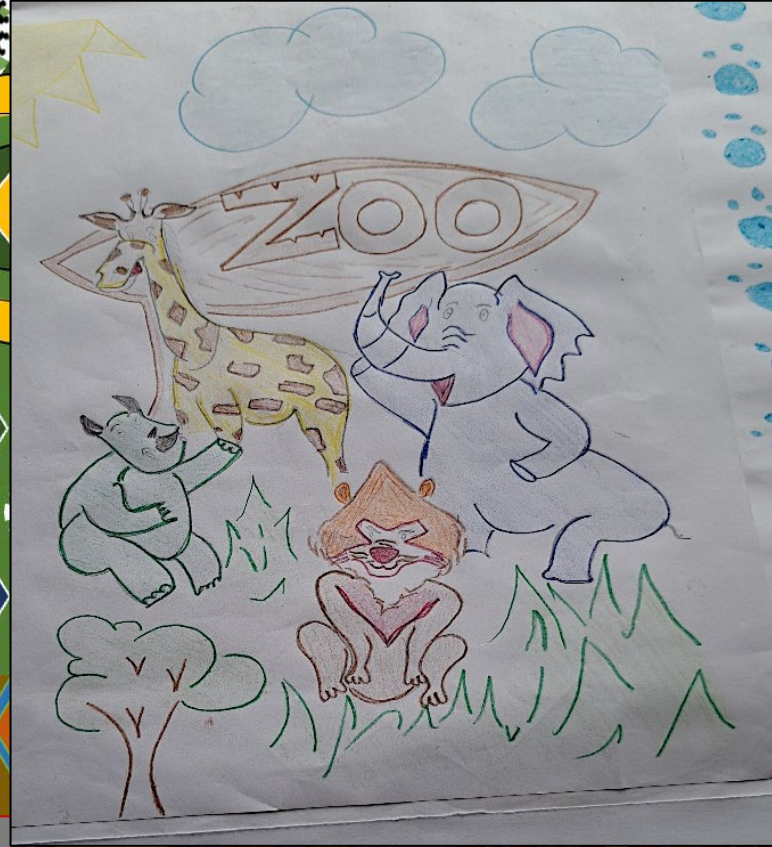

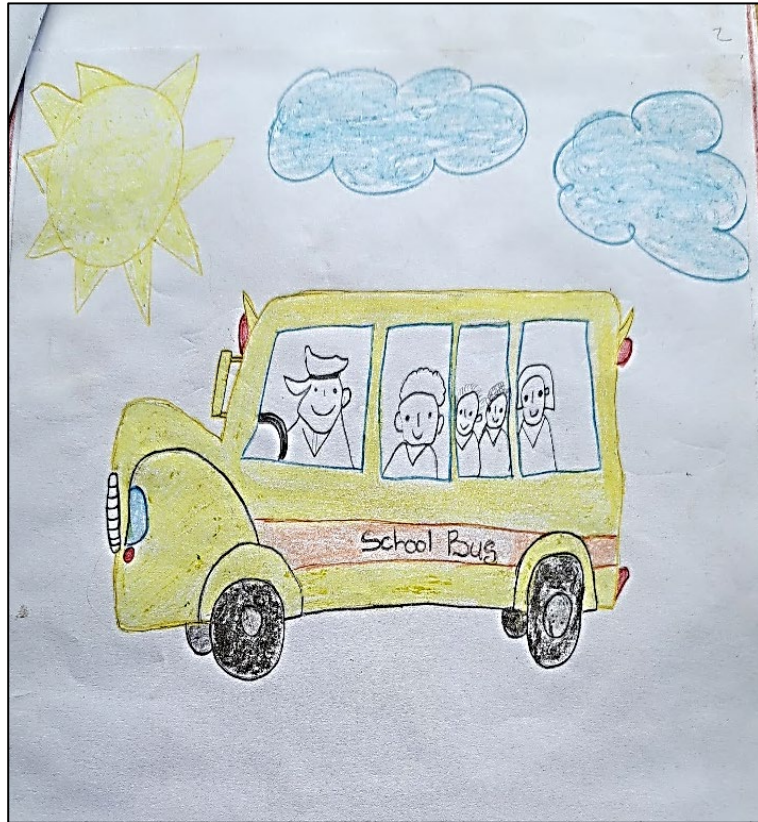

The learners were very happy and eager to see animals.



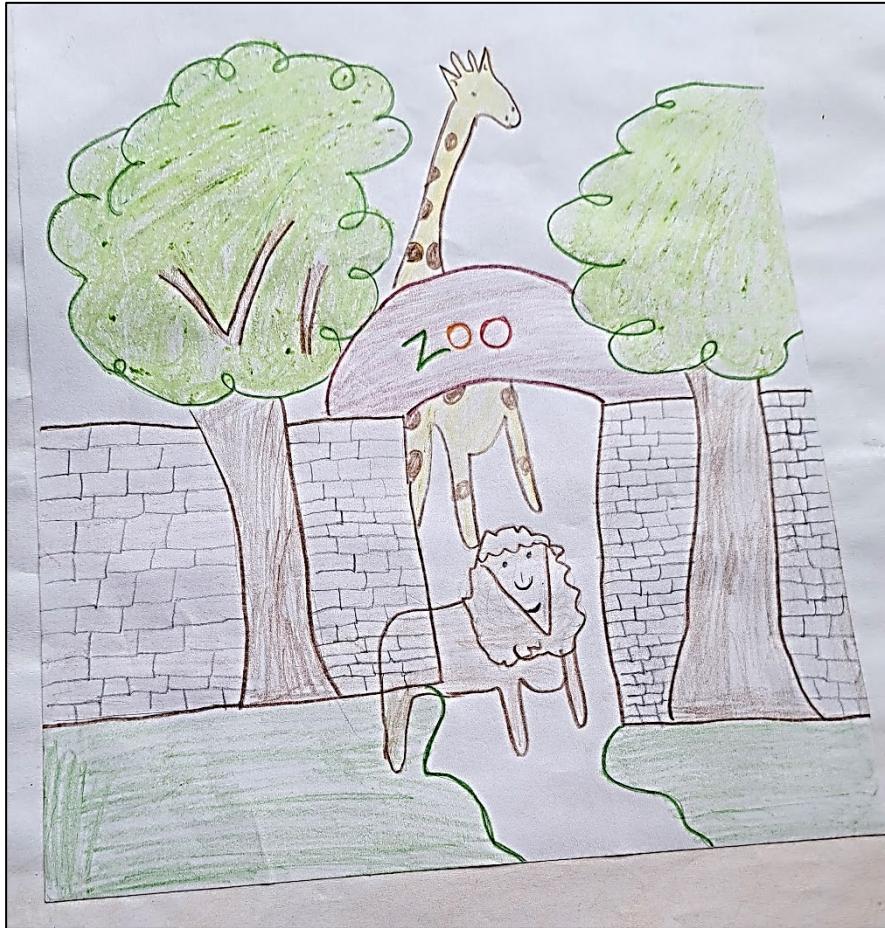
The bus left for Gauteng. On their way, the bus had a problem with a tyre
