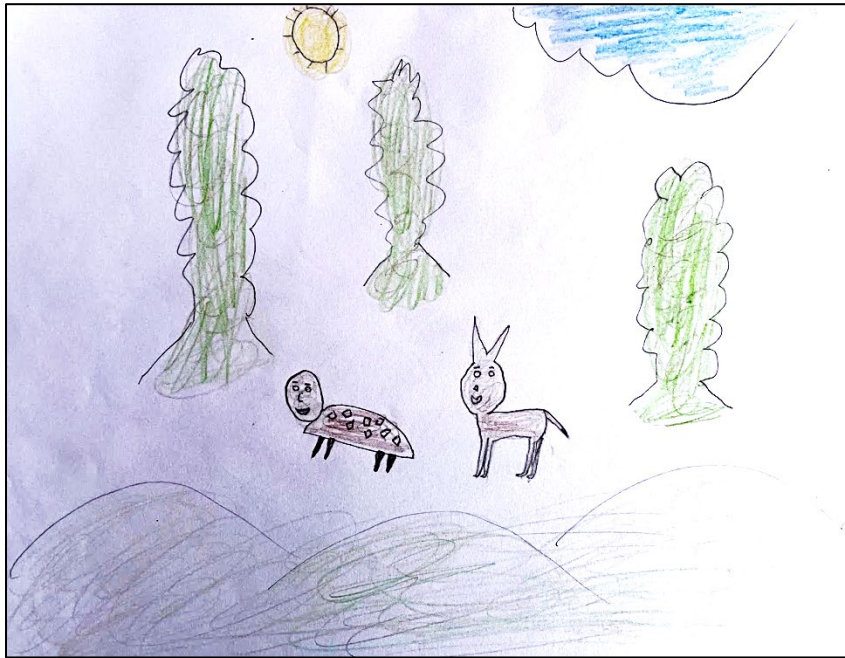

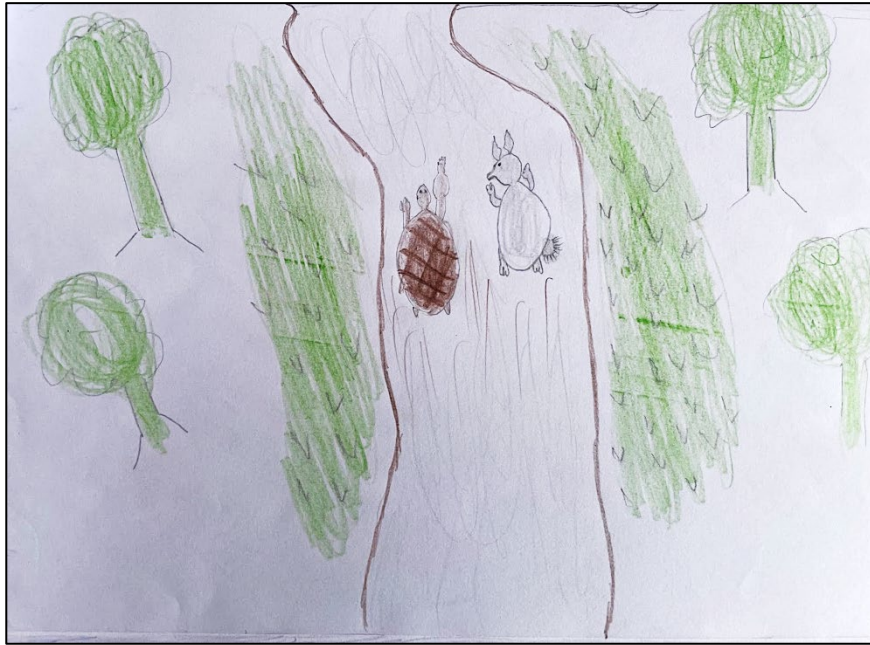




Tortoise and rabbit lived together in the veld; they were friends.
