

Figure 2: Pain interference and morphine equivalent dose opioid use baseline and 12-month scores

The parallel line plots contain a line for each participant in the study with baseline and 12-month data available. Each line starts at the baseline value (circle) and extends along the line to the 12-month value. The lower plot shows the PROMIS-8A standardised T score, with higher scores signifying higher pain interference in daily life (See Table 1 footnote f for information on PROMIS-8A scoring and ranges). The higher plot shows the daily morphine equivalent dose (continuous value) used in the previous 4 weeks from the timepoint. To the right are the corresponding box and whisker plots with line and box indicating median and first and third quartile ranges, whiskers indicating 1.5x the interquartile range, and dots representing more extreme data.
