




Figure 2A, 2B:



**D: Higher HIV amongst orphaned children in high-burden locations.** (Population-based HIV Impact Assessments)




**B: Children and adolescents living with HIV, 2023**






PEPFAR's system of screening, referral, prevention of revictimization and support for children and adolescents, through faith- and community-based organizations.





**A: Without PEPFAR, a million more new child HIV-infections by 2030**

Additional Child HIV Infections (cumulative)




**B: Without PEPFAR, 460,000 more child AIDS deaths by 2030**
